As we look back on 2018, we are amazed and thankful at the opportunities the Lord provided for us to share Jesus with others, both at home and in foreign lands. We owe heartfelt thanks to so many of you for generous donations of supplies for our craft items. Here are just a few of the ways YOU helped us share the love of Jesus this year:

- * Crosses and bears were sent to Nicaragua, Zambia, and Costa Rica with scriptures in the native language of each country.
- * Teachers and Staff at East Coweta High School were given an Appreciation Reception.
- * Crosses and bears were sent to Kentucky with our own mission team.
- * Handmade Items, with scripture, were distributed at the Turin Tractor Pull.
- * Burp pads were made for the Coweta County Crisis Pregnancy Center.
- * Gifted residents at Ansley Park Nursing and Rehab Center in Newnan with handmade scripture items, crosses and bears.
- * Hundreds of handmade bracelets, Bible Story Lessons, crosses and bears were distributed in North Carolina following Hurricane Florence, and in Florida following Hurricane Michael, via the Southern Baptist disaster Relief Team. Scriptures were printed in English and Spanish. The SBC congregation provided \$313 for the purchase of crayons to be used with the Bible Story Lessons.

As we look ahead, we anticipate another great year. We are already busy creating pillowcase dresses and crosses to be presented to Appalachian Ministries in the spring, as well as creating bears and crosses for Andy Cook's mission trip to Ghana, West Africa. A large number of items are also being created for SBC's own mission trip next summer.

Our hope for 2019 is that YOU will consider joining our craft team which meets each Wednesday at 10 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall. It is a wonderful opportunity to learn about missions, and it may be just the mission outreach the Lord speaks to you about as 2019 approaches. Again, thanks for the tremendous support this year!

"There that's the last one." I snapped the final portion of toy train track circling the Christmas tree. The kids were having fun watching the train cars travel around and around. Just to tease her and to hear her laugh, I said to my granddaughter, Aria, "You know, I'm five. Just like you." Aria giggled and said, "Uh-uh." I retorted. "Uh-huh." Again, "Uh-uh;" "Uh-huh." Then, "You're silly, Andandy (her name for me)--you're a *Man*. . . . cuz you wear. . . a *WATCH*!" . . . I looked at her little face and then down at my left wrist. What could I say? She was right!




On Veterans Day last month, Mike Exner invited all of our veterans up to the choir to sing "God Bless America" Then our wonderful church family
