Away in a Manger

It's that time of the year now, where we all get out the Christmas decorations and put them out. Probably one of our favorite activities—and usually the first—is setting up the Nativity scene. I remember when Jill and I bought our manger scene, back when our girls were very young, during a family trip to Gatlinburg. When it comes to manger scenes, I have had special experiences that make mangers more real for me. At Unity Baptist Church in Newnan, where I was a member, the church presented a live nativity scene every year. We had a pasture behind the church with a manger structure built back on a rolling hillside. About 20 of us took part in the scene, and we practiced until we were ready for the many visitors who would come to view our life-size scene. We had a speaker system with narration as the scene took place. Over the years, I was dressed as a shepherd, a king, and once, even Joseph.

Joseph had to have a level head and have donkey-managing skills. Yes, the donkey had to be steady so that Mary would not fall off and yet strong enough to carry Mary to the manger. No cowboy saddles permitted here. The donkey also had to have a pace not too fast or too slow, because the visual activity had to be coordinated with recorded narration. Our donkey, at some point, figured out there was the sweet reward of livestock feed at the end of this journey, so keeping him slowed down was really the main effort. After it was over, we would all come back to the church fellowship hall and drink hot chocolate and reflect on the night's performance. Good times! I cherished those days.

Children love to sing "Away in a Manger," a beautiful carol from the 1800's. The stanzas were written by different people, including at least one by Martin Luther. Just like our home nativity scenes and plays like the one I was in, the song brings to reality the picture of the birth of a little baby boy so long ago.

And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling clothes, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

At some time during the season, we will be singing this hymn. I hope it will remind us all of the magnificent but so humble a manner in which our Savior came to this earth to save mankind. I hope it will bring back cherished times in your life.
